
## ***ANNUAL REPORT: 2022***

During the calendar year of 2022, officers conducted the required annual trainings with a total of 242 hours. This included areas of training such as DUI investigations, safe pursuit, child abuse, domestic violence investigations and other requirements as set forth by the New Mexico Law Enforcement Academy.

Officers also conducted advanced trainings in areas such as Officer Wellness PTS/PTSD awareness, Investigating officer involved use of force, Advanced SWAT, Southwest Women in Law Enforcement Conference, Public Safety Leadership, Supervision of Police Personnel, First Line Supervisor, Basic and Advanced K-9 Handler, Drug Recognition Expert Re-Certification and many other areas of leadership and specific expertise of law enforcement totaling 837.5 hours.

Many of the advanced courses were completed on-line, and on the officer's own time. The officers asked for these trainings so that they can provide the best leadership and law enforcement services to the community.

We have one of, if not the best, 15-man police department within New Mexico. I would be remiss if I did not include our two civilians that work with us. They assist behind the scenes and aide us in our duties. These dedicated professionals are honorable men and women. I am honored to work along side everyone of them and look forward to the advancement of our department for 2023.
