The above graphs are a snapshot of the work that officers completed for the year. This does not include the hundreds of hours of training that officers completed to maintain their certifications and enhanced training.

Officers have completed advanced training in areas such as drug enforcement operations, law enforcement leadership, DUI investigations, domestic violence investigations and many more. The New Mexico Municipal League has provided a great resource with Lexipol to provide a streamlined training platform as well as assistance with Standard Operating Procedures. This will aid us in getting accredited through the State and have a potential cost benefit for the Police Department Insurance.

The Sergeants have completed an advanced first line supervision course, Supervision of Police Personnel through North Western University. This advanced leadership course has enhanced their abilities not only with the effective leadership of patrol officers, it has also given them more insight into the detailed workings of the Department.

Our civilian staff have worked just as hard behind the scenes. The processing of hundreds of pieces of evidence, redacting body worn camera footage and reports, as well as generating and completing monthly reports to the FBI for national statistics takes up a lot of time. We are working diligently to digitize our records so that we have a greater ease of research and storage.

Lieutenant Dominguez and Evidence Technician Lucero have been working tirelessly on cleaning up the evidence room and procedures. They have successfully purged more than 1000 items from the evidence room. This has not only freed up space for storage and safe movement, it has also provided a more streamlined system in which evidence can be located. Ms. Lucero has attended several training courses for best practices in the efficiency of maintaining and operating an evidence room.

We conducted traffic safety for the annual parade, hosted the annual car show to benefit NM Special Olympics, traffic safety for the Christmas parade and facilitated raising money and toys for the toy drive. We were able to host 3 blood drives last year to help the local need for blood donations.
