The above graphs are a snapshot of the work that officers completed for the year. This does not include the hundreds of hours of training that officers completed to maintain their certifications and enhanced training.

Officers have completed advanced training in areas such as drug enforcement operations, law enforcement leadership, DUI investigations, domestic violence investigations and many more. We have partnered with an on-line training academy to streamline some of the basic courses and maximize the officer's time.

Our civilian staff have worked just as hard behind the scenes. The processing of hundreds of pieces of evidence, redacting body worn camera footage and reports, as well as generating and completing monthly reports to the FBI for national statistics takes up a lot of time.

We conducted traffic safety for the annual parade, hosted the annual car show to benefit NM Special Olympics, traffic safety for the Christmas parade and facilitated raising money and toys for the toy drive. We were able to host 3 blood drives last year to help the local need for blood donations.

We look forward to 2024 and all that it brings.
