The above graphs are a snapshot of the work that officers completed for the year. This does not include the hundreds of hours of training that officers completed to maintain their certifications and enhanced training.

Officers have completed advanced training in areas such as drug enforcement operations, law enforcement leadership, DUI investigations, domestic violence investigations and many more. New Mexico Municipal League has provided the Lexipol platform for law enforcement agencies across New Mexico for advancing standards. We have taken advantage of this platform. This also allows us access to other online training through Police One Academy. This training allows officers to complete required annual training as well as advanced training.

We have an officer that has completed Crisis Negotiator Training. He is now a certified negotiator for the regional SWAT Team. He is also on an “on-call” status for other officers when they have a situation that may require his expertise in dealing with a person in crisis. He has already used his skills several times in December with exceptional outcomes.

We are in the process of developing a drone program. With the recent operator certification, we have an officer that has developed a program, looking for grants and seeking other officers that are interested in the program. This program will enhance the Department’s capability to respond safely to potentially hazardous situations.

Our civilian staff have worked just as hard behind the scenes. The processing of hundreds of pieces of evidence, redacting body worn camera footage and reports, as well as

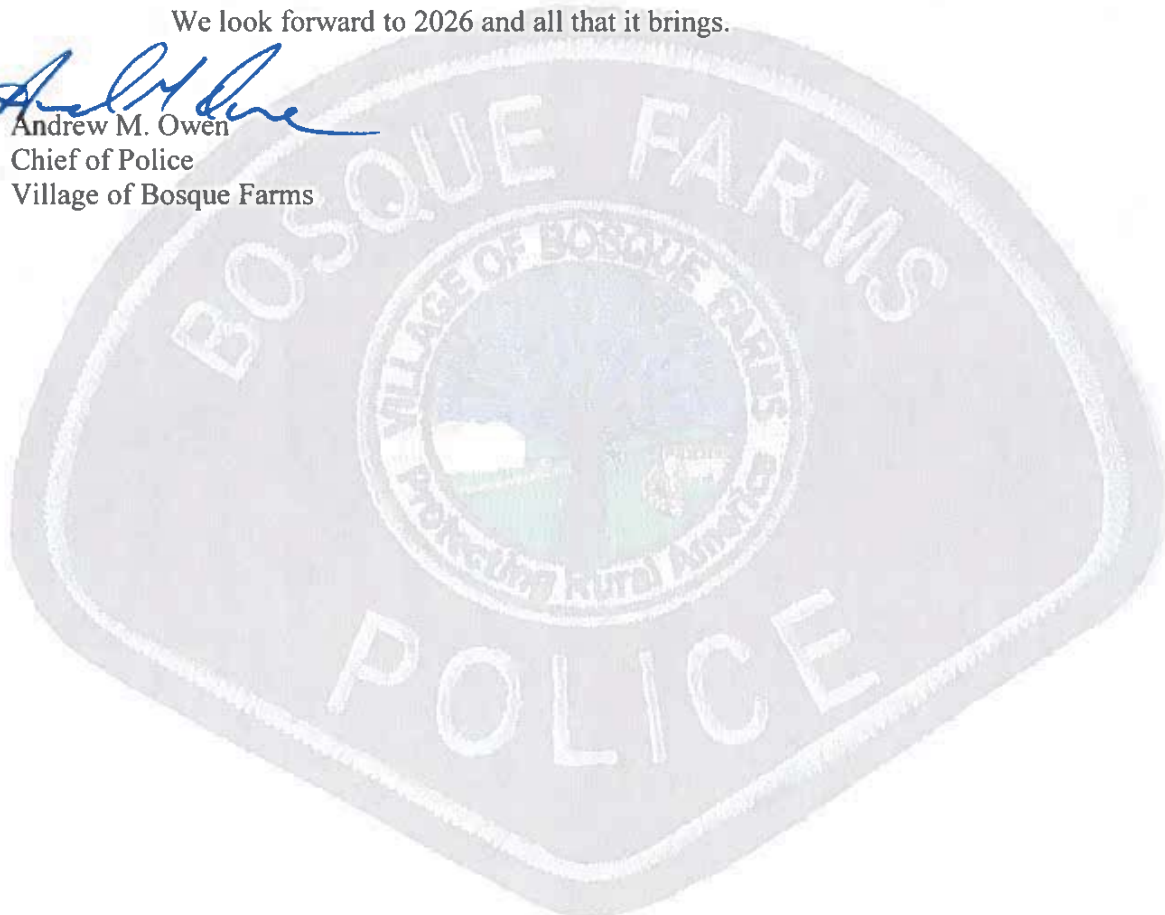

generating and completing monthly reports to the FBI for national statistics takes up a lot of time. Our evidence room has been purged of items that are no longer of evidentiary value and the owner's could not be located.

We conducted traffic safety for the annual parade, hosted the annual car show to benefit NM Special Olympics, traffic safety for the Christmas parade and facilitated raising money and toys for the toy drive. We were able to host 3 blood drives last year to help the local need for blood donations.

We look forward to 2026 and all that it brings.
