I'm pleased and happy to be back serving the Village of Bosque Farms community. My door is always open and I'm here to help in any way I can. I appreciate Mayor Walkup for appointing me and the Village Councilors approving the appointment. I will do my absolute best for the Village of Bosque Farms.

Upon my return, I hit the ground running working on the FY 2023-2024 budget and preparing for local elections. The Village Council has opted to use Valencia County for the election process. There will still be early voting and the ability to vote here in the Village. - August 29, 2023, 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. (one day only) Candidate Filing Date.
- September 5, 2023, 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. (one day only) Write-in Candidate Filing Date.
- October 15, 2023, to November 3, 2023, Early Voting.
- November 7, 2023, Regular Local Election Date.
- January 1, 2024, Term of Office begins for newly elected candidates.

Please be diligent to the dates and where to file for candidacy.

As of this newsletter we will be in our new fiscal year budget. As always, we ask to support local businesses because it benefits the entire village. Water Department

Greetings residents! I hope everyone is staying safe and well hydrated during this summer heat!

A few things to remind residents of: annual utility rate increases went into effect in July. You will see the increase on your monthly bill beginning in Aug., when we bill for your July consumption. The Village is no longer giving pool fill-up adjustments on accounts. We apologize for any inconvenience to the residents. We have had an increase in damaged water meters due to residents and plumbers attempting to turn water off/on. I want to remind everyone that this is not only unsafe for residents, but it is also against Ordinance (9-2-18) for anyone not employed with the Village to tamper with water meters. We recommend residents install a property shut off valve for their convenience to turn the water on and off and avoid any fees associated with having the Water Department come out to turn water off/on.

The 2022 Consumer Confidence Report (CCR) is now available for residents to view and is posted to our website at www.bosquefarmsnm.gov.

Please take note when contacting the police department, the Village office phone number (869-2358) should only be utilized to obtain administrative type services. This is the number to the department's Administration and Records Clerk. Only use this number to retrieve a report, speak with a supervisor or leave a message for a specific officer. The police department's business hours are Monday through Friday, 7:30 am to 4:30 pm.

If you need the assistance of a police officer or need to report a crime, please call the Valencia Regional Emergency Communications Center (DISPATCH) at 865-9130. To report a crime in progress or to report an emergency dial "911". Please remember: When you see someone behaving in a suspicious manner or hear a suspicious noise like breaking glass, please call our dispatch center immediately. Your assistance in helping curb crime in Bosque Farms is vital to our community! Remember your eyes and ears are one of our best resources.

School will start just around the corner, August 1st. Children will be walking and riding their bikes to school, keep an eye out for them when at intersections. **Please** educate your children on proper safety when riding bikes.

The year 2022 was a very busy year for BFPD. Officers issued 3,303 traffic and misdemeanor citations, wrote 733 reports, investigated 122 traffic crashes, made 310 arrests all while answering 5,908 calls for service.

Dukan (our K-9) has been retired and is living the good life on the couch of Cpl Killough. Dobby (New K-9) has been putting in the hard work and has become nationally certified as a narcotic detection and patrol K-9. He along with his handler (Brad Killough), average 30 hours of training a month. He trains on tracking, apprehension and narcotic detection.

We want everyone to come out to the Bosque Farms Fair and meet our officers. We have also invited Safer New Mexico to set up a booth for traffic safety, seat belt information and car seat inspections.

Vitalant will have the Blood Mobile out for your donation. New Mexico is in dire need of more blood donations.

Our Toys for Tots campaign will Kick off in November with giving boxes set up at Dollar General, Caliente Designs and the Village office. If you do not want to give a new toy, you can always stop in the Police Department

and donate money. The toys and money donated will benefit children from Bosque Farms Elementary, Peralta Elementary School as well as the Valencia County Shelter Services. Our small Village is filled with residents that have huge hearts!

Our Community Watch Program is doing a great job of making our Village safer. Our Volunteers provide a tremendous service to this community. They donated 222 hours of their time in 2020, making a huge difference in our village. THANK YOU SO MUCH!!!!! When you see our Community Watch vehicle out & about, please wave and smile at our volunteers. When you are leaving town and would like to be put on the Residence Watch list, stop by the Village office or police station and fill out a form.

Your Police Department has grown over the last year. We now have 15 sworn police officers, 1 full time and 1 part time civilian. We have all new patrol cars, new computer systems and other new technologies that have been obtained through state funding.

We thank you for your continued support and look forward to seeing you at the Fair and around the streets this summer.

Water Leak Reports

If you feel like that your consumption is high or you suspect a leak, don't hesitate to call. We can download a report from your radio read water meter that will give us leak information, which will show an intermittent leak or a continuous leak, or no leak at all.

Disconnect/Reconnect Fees

If we are called out to shut off water service due to leaks and repairs, a **\$15.00 disconnect fee** to shut off the water will be billed to your water account. In addition, a **\$15.00 reconnect fee** will be billed when the water is turned back on.

Reminder: The base rate for water increase is 2% and the base rate for sewer increase is 3% on July 1 of every year.


Congratulations Growers Market customers.

Commission Information:

The Planning and Zoning Commission meets every first Monday of the month at 6:30 pm in the Council Chambers. I would like to encourage all Village residents to take part in these meetings. This is where ordinances are developed, subdivisions, variances, conditional use permits, and much more are considered. These discussions have a large impact on your community. So please be informed and be involved, this is your community.

I want to remind everyone that most development in the Village requires a permit. "Development" doesn't just refer to new homes being built. Development can include sheds, carports, some fencing materials, roof repairs, and more. The permitting also gives you important information regarding the placement of development such as setbacks from property lines.

Bosque Farms is in the Flood Plain and it is important to record impermeable surfaces in the floodplain, so some things may not be as apparent to permit such as pouring concrete for walkways and patios or placing pavers, even some fence choices may have an impact on flooding.

We have three new Commissioners that have been appointed to your Planning and Zoning Commission. Michael Baber, Chris Gillespie & Kevin Schaus.

Community report:

We are in that weed time of year, a time that none of us like. 7-3-4 (A) Owner/occupant responsibility: (1) The person in charge of the real property is required and responsible to take the appropriate action for the control of weeds in conformance with this section: (a) on the real property owned or occupied by them; (b) In the alley and/or public utility easement abutting such real property to it center line; and (c) In the area between such real property and the edge of any abutting street. (2) Each such person in charge of property shall destroy, cut, control, and remove such weed as often as the growth and condition of such weeds may require in order to maintain a maximum height of 12' inches. Last year, 264 citations were issued for weeds, this takes time and money from the community especially when it goes to court. Currently as of June 2023, 142

citations have been issued with only 4 going to court, and 12 being fined \$50+.

The Village of Bosque Farms has 334 active business license registrations, anyone prior to engaging in any business activity must be licensed with the village. 52 of those licenses did not renew their license on March 16, 2022 as required by 5-1-4 and will be deactivated.

The Village of Bosque Farms issued 45 building permits in 2023. These permits include fencing, new homes, concrete pads, sheds/garages, etc. 4 permits have been denied for not having a registered license or plans not being in compliance with the VoBF Ordinances.

I've had many questions about the large piece of land that is being developed on Bosque Farms Blvd. I invite anyone who wants to see plans for that area or any other development to come to the office.

Utilities Department

Summer is here, and the plants will be growing. Please keep in mind, it makes it easier for your utility workers when weeds, and debris are maintained around your grinder pump stations, electric boxes, and water meters. It also makes the job go faster so your back in service sooner.

If your light or buzzer ever goes off on your grinder pump, please call right away. During business hours, call the office, 869-2358. After hours or holidays, call dispatch, 865-9130. We are on call 24-hours a day and there are no reset buttons for you to push for the grinder pump. A little reminder you can stop the buzzer if you push the button on the lower left side of the control box, the light will remain lit.

The Village of Bosque Farms Water department takes pride in providing clean, safe and affordable water. It is important to check for leaks regularly around your property and inside your home. A small leak over a billing cycle can add up quickly. A little tip, check those running toilets and swamp coolers. Please call if you notice that your bill has increased, and you have not used any more water than usual. Your utility operators will gladly help investigate or determine if you have a leak.

We have completed the Consumer Confidence Report (CCR) for 2022, if you would like to check out how your water is doing, we have it on the web site www.bosqueframs.gov/wter.

A reminder to avoid any damages to equipment, the only people that should access water meters, control boxes and grinder pump stations are water and sewer department employees. We don't want to have to fine or bill anyone for damages, water loss and man hours to fix damaged equipment.

Please don't run over or park on the water meters or sewer pads. This can damage both meter cans and sewer pads as well as the underground pipes.

Rehab of the UV system at the water treatment plant is almost completed.

We have also started to spray for mosquitoes, you will see us out after sunset and before sunrise.

We would like to welcome Edward Romero to the Village of Bosque Farms family, he has joined our team of utility operators.
